Extra thankful for this set-up crew of staff members from PCS and a group from Sigma Nu Fraternity.








Groups of students made a significant impact on our Festival of Trees event. A group of students from Bushland Highschool decorated the upside down tree on the left.



Ride the Bus

Recently our CEAP (Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program) staff were scheduled to ride on Panhandle Community Services buses throughout the Panhandle to meet clients, interact with our bus drivers and gain a better understanding of our clients, especially their participation on our transit system.

Alma, our Program Specialist from Dumas, shared that she met client "S" on a recent bus ride. David, the bus driver told Alma it had been complicated to communicate with "S" because of a language barrier. Alma speaks Spanish and was able to have a conversation with her. She stated she was behind on her rent and bills. She has five children, ages 1, 2, 5, 9 and 11. "S" is working but because the children had a lot of illness she lost her job. She did find a new job and recently started working there. She is currently trying to catch up on bills because of all the transitions. She doesn't have transportation and has to pay someone to take kids to school, she walks to take one child to Intermediate School. We were able to refer "S" to a local food pantry and our Hygiene Closet. We are currently working towards helping her with a water bill.
